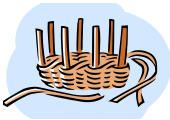

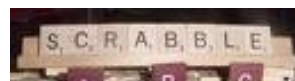


The Avalon Library Knitters meet at 3:30 every Monday afternoon. All levels are welcome.
